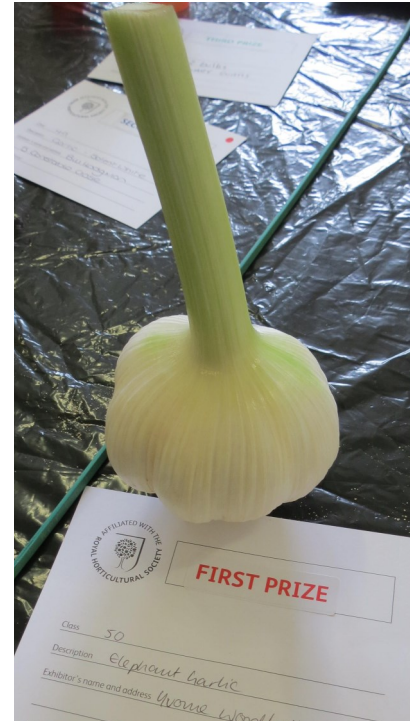


ELEPHANT GARLIC



- Elephant Garlic is actually a member of the leek family despite it looking and tasting like garlic. Despite its size, it is very mild so you can still use a single large clove like you would use a regular clove.
- Our plants have been sown in pots in the autumn and kept outdoors over winter to ensure they form proper bulbs. When you take them home, plant them directly into the ground (or a very large container of garden soil) and keep them well watered during dry periods to ensure they swell up.
- Harvest your Elephant Garlic when the leaves die back and turn yellow, and once lifted, clean them off and allow them to dry out in a warm position as this will help them store better.
- We've had a lot of success with our Elephant Garlic, and with good care, you can expect them to reach around 10cm across, each bulb containing 6 - 8 cloves.
