

ANTIRRHINUM



Also known as snapdragons, these are dwarf, bushy plants that make a bright display at the front of the border or in containers, perfect for smaller gardens too.

They like a well-drained soil in a sunny position, and in milder areas they can over-winter and flower again the following year.

CALENDULA



Calendula are also known as pot marigolds. They are extremely easy to grow, tolerate poor soils and can often over-winter in milder areas. They have daisy-like flowers in a mix of oranges and yellows, and are particularly good for bees and other beneficial insects. The flowers are also edible for humans too!

COSMOS



Cosmos are very easy to grow. They tolerate poor soil, heat, and dry conditions, and will reach 1m tall. They have an upright habit with strong stems, ferny foliage and lots of daisy-like flowers, and are great for attracting butterflies. Pink/white, orange/yellow and dwarf mixes are available. The long-lasting blooms are also great as cut flowers and this helps them to keep flowering right up to the first frosts.

DWARF FRENCH MARIGOLDS



These Dwarf Marigolds grow to around 35cm tall, making them great for the front of borders. They are highly aromatic, and planted alongside tomatoes, they will help to ward off white-fly as well as bringing pollinators into your greenhouse. They like a free-draining soil in a sunny position, and regular dead-heading will encourage even more flowers all summer long.
